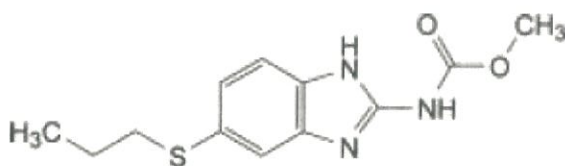
Section 1: Chemical Product and Company Identification

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Section 2: Composition and Information on Ingredients

Composition: Albendazole contains not less than 98.0 per cent and nor more than 102.0 per cent of C₁₂H₁₅N₃O₂S, calculated on the dried basis.

Toxicological Data on Ingredients: Albendazole: ORAL (LD₅₀): Acute: 2400 mg/kg [Rat]. 1500 mg/kg [Mouse]. 10000 mg/kg [Hamster].

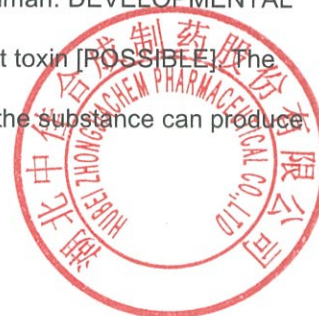
Section 3: Hazards Identification

Potential Acute Health Effects: Hazardous in case of skin contact (irritant), of eye contact (irritant), of ingestion, of inhalation.

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Potential Chronic Health Effects:

Section 4: First Aid Measures

Eye Contact:

Check for and remove any contact lenses. In case of contact, immediately flush eyes with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes. Get medical attention.

In case of contact, immediately flush skin with plenty of water. Cover the irritated skin with an emollient. Remove contaminated clothing and shoes. Wash clothing before reuse. Thoroughly clean shoes before reuse. Get medical attention.

Serious Skin Contact:

Wash with a disinfectant soap and cover the contaminated skin with an anti-bacterial cream. Seek immediate medical attention.

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Precautions:

In case of insufficient ventilation, wear suitable respiratory equipment. If ingested, seek medical advice immediately and show the container or the label. Avoid contact with skin and eyes.

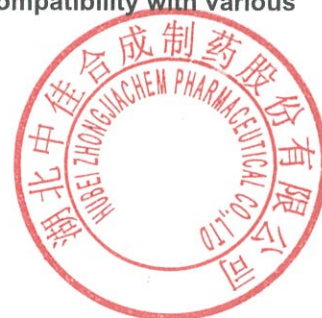

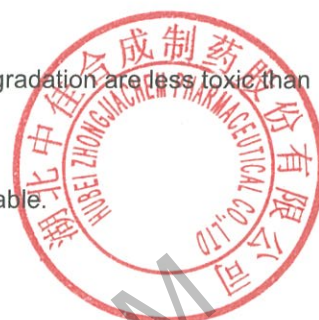
